




A Year of Celebrations and Impact

One of the key highlights of the year was the celebration of our 20th anniversary a significant milestone that marked two decades of supporting and empowering migrants and diverse communities across Counties Meath and Louth. The event was attended by 81 guests, including community members, partners, and supporters, and served as a powerful reminder of how far we have come and the positive impact we continue to make


During the celebration, we shared a special moment as the cake was cut to commemorate this remarkable achievement, symbolizing the growth and success we've experienced over the years. The event also featured a variety of stalls where members of the community showcased their businesses, reflecting the vibrant entrepreneurial spirit and cultural diversity within our network. Additionally, we proudly released our new magazine on the same day, marking a new chapter in our commitment to sharing stories and experiences that reflect the diverse voices of our community.





Career :::::: FastTrack Project Overall Objective:

The project aimed to support 363 legally resident migrants facing barriers to participation by providing career support, language training, and accredited professional training, leading to higher employability, participation, and further education.



Summary:

This project made remarkable progress in supporting migrants through career development, language training, and professional upskilling. By successfully engaging community stakeholders and providing tailored services, the initiative has helped migrants overcome barriers to employment, further education, and social integration. The project also laid the groundwork for future expansion and support in Louth.

Career FastTrack Project

Community Connect Project

Project Description:



The Communities Connect project aimed to support the integration of young male International Protection Applicants (IPAs) aged 19-25 in County Meath, Louth, and Monaghan. The initiative focused on building capacity through tailored workshops, mentoring, and engagement with host communities. By pairing 30 mentees with 30 volunteer mentors, the project successfully exceeded its target, fostering stronger community ties and local integration

Key Activities:

Mentoring Program: 30 IPA mentees were paired with 30 local mentors, facilitating cultural exchange and integration.

Workshops & Networking: Participants attended various events, including onboarding sessions, a cultural networking dinner, and social activities to build community connections.

Contribution to the IPA Community:

The project improved access to support services and enhanced confidence among participants in seeking services. It promoted social cohesion, especially in Termonfeckin, and addressed barriers such as poverty, discrimination, and limited education access. The initiative also helped prepare young IPAs for the changes in the asylum process, enabling them to work while awaiting decisions on their cases.

Participants:

- Mentors and Mentees: 52
- Local IPA Participants: 15
- Volunteers: 50 volunteers, including
 20 from the IPA community.

Project Expenditure:


- Total Expenditure: €20,000
- Key Costs: Recruitment, training programs, workshops, networking events, staff allowances, and venue hires.

Key Events & Activities (Summary)

- Women's Health Workshop (March 5, 2024): Focused on cancer awareness and prevention, fostering open discussions on health.
- International Women's Day (March 8, 2024): A successful celebration of women's achievements
- Mental Health Jewellery Workshop (June 14, 2024): Combined creative expression with mental health discussions, fostering empowerment and emotional connection.
- Africa Day Planning (May 2024): Women played a key role in organizing the event, contributing to its success through collaboration and teamwork.



Challenges Encountered:

- Member drop-offs due to relocation and work commitments.
- Managing differing perspectives and schedules during event planning.



Participation by Nationality:

The group attracted diverse participants from countries including Sudan, Nigeria, Zimbabwe, Algeria, South Africa, Sierra Leone, and more.

Conclusion:

The group had a successful year, empowering women through continuous engagement, health awareness, and workshops. Attendance remained high, with notable achievements in fostering inclusivity and community integration.



Cultur Cycle Connect

Empowering Communities Through Cycling

As part of Bike Week 2024, Cultur Cycle Connect organised an engaging cycling event to promote safe cycling practices, physical well-being, and community inclusion. The event combined a Safety Awareness Workshop and a Cycling Tour, creating an immersive experience for participants of diverse backgrounds.


Summary

- 20 participants (10 male, 10 female) from various age groups
- Comprehensive Safety Awareness Workshop led by a cycling expert
- Guided cycling tour at Blackwater Park to enhance endurance and confidence
- Discussion on the mental health benefits of physical activity
- Live entertainment & community engagement through music and poetry

Key Achievements

The event successfully:

- ✓ Promoted cycling among migrants, fostering an inclusive cycling community
- ✓ Improved cycling skills and road safety awareness
- ✓ Encouraged physical and mental well-being through active participation
- ✓ Fostered community and facilitated integration



Challenges & Future Recommendations:

With over 70 interested participants, demand exceeded available resources.

Future events would benefit from increased funding to accommodate more participants, particularly from Direct Provision Centres.



Connect4Inclusion

Project Overview

The Connect4Inclusion initiative promoted intercultural awareness and social cohesion through interactive workshops and community engagement.

The project included:

- Four cultural competence sessions and four allyship workshops, equipping participants with strategies to address discrimination and foster inclusion.
- Creative methods such as drama, arts, and canvas painting to make intercultural learning engaging.
- Training 18 peer ambassadors to produce campaign materials, enhancing outreach and sustainability.







Key Achievements

- 1. 8 interactive workshops on cultural competence and allyship
- 2. 18 peer ambassadors trained to create and share awareness campaigns
- 3. 44 participants engaged, with 35 from migrant backgrounds
- 4. Creative learning methods such as drama and arts to deepen understanding
- 5. Stronger community alliances built through networking events

Impact on Community Integration

- Fostered understanding of cultural diversity and encouraged inclusive practices.
- Enabled participants to develop practical tools for allyship and intercultural dialogue.
- Strengthened community connections by breaking down barriers and promoting shared responsibility for inclusion.
- Trained ambassadors played a key role in extending the project's reach and embedding integration practices within the community.


Project Expenditure

Funds were allocated to workshop delivery, venue hire, participant travel, promotional materials, and administration.

Be Safe In Your Space

Project Aims & Objectives

Aims to strengthen relationships between An Garda Síochána and migrant communities, enhance safety awareness, and empower families to tackle antisocial behavior. The month of August saw the successful launch of the program's Ambassadors Program, along with a series of focused activities and meetings aimed at promoting community safety.



Participant Feedback

- Participants appreciated the clear and structured presentation of the program.
- There was enthusiasm about the opportunity to become certified Ambassadors and to contribute to community safety.
- Feedback from the Focus Group Meetings indicated a positive reception and highlighted the importance of ongoing safety initiatives in Direct Provision Centres.

The Future of the Project...

- Future modules, including Fire Safety, being prepared based on participant feedback. Plans include making sessions more interactive and tailored to diverse community needs.
- Design and distribution of educational materials, including manuals, toolkits, and social media content, to further engage participants.


Migrant Network Community Development Project (Meath & Louth)

The Cultúr Migrant Centre has continued to grow its impact across Counties Meath and Louth through the Migrant Network Community Development Project. This initiative actively challenges social exclusion, discrimination, and inequality faced by ethnic minorities. It promotes empowerment, participation, and community organising, while fostering strong collaboration with local stakeholders.

Key Highlights from 2024

- €60,927 in funding raised to support ongoing activities.
- New ethnic groups identified and supported across both counties.
- 2 migrant networks established and integrated into local PPN structures.
- New office opened in Dundalk, expanding our physical presence in Louth.
- Multiple action meetings held with civil society stakeholders.
- Consultations with migrant leaders conducted from January to December.
- 25 migrant leaders supported through capacity-building initiatives.
- 16 migrant-led organisations strengthened.





Looking Ahead:

Cultúr Migrant Centre continues to advocate for:

- A dedicated one-stop shop for migrants in the region.
- Greater involvement of migrants in local commerce.
- Targeted LCDC-led funding for integration and community-based initiatives.

Strategic Alignment with LECP

The project aligns with key actions under the Local Economic and Community Plan (LECP):

- Action 4.3.5 Promoted intercultural awareness and education.
- Action 6.2.4 Increased participation opportunities for ethnic minorities.
- Action 7.1.4 Responded to needs identified in the Migrants Needs Analysis.
- Action 4.3.3 Ensured accessible election information in multiple languages.



Campaigns and outreach included:

- 4 capacity-building programmes delivered.
- 15 consultation processes with key institutions (e.g., SIPTU, TUSLA, Navan Family Centre).
- 12 women's group meetings.
- Engagements with 2 schools, 4 libraries, 2 mosques, and 3 Christian churches.

Anti-racism workshops and events, including:

- Anti-racism Day with Meath Traveller Workshop.
- · Ramadan Celebration.

Promotion of political participation, with:

- "Your Voice Matters" workshops in Louth and Meath.
- 25 multilingual election information leaflets distributed (in 9 languages).

Recognition: The project was awarded the Louth PPN Award in November 2023.



Community Impact

- Strengthened ties between migrant communities and Irish society.
- Supported schools to address diversity and inclusion challenges.
- Amplified the voices of migrants and refugees through interagency collaboration.
- Raised awareness of workers' rights and reported 6 incidents of racism.
- Supported and mentored new volunteers contributing to local campaigns.



Bringing Joy and Dignity at Christmas: Supporting Families in Direct Provision

In December 2024, with the generous support of the Lakeside Fund, Cultúr Migrant Centre delivered a heart-warming initiative to bring relief and joy to children and families living in Direct Provision centres across County Meath.

Thanks to a grant of €12,020, we purchased and distributed 601 Me2You vouchers (valued at €20 each), ensuring that every child received a meaningful gift during the festive season.



















Centres Supported:

- Ashbourne Hotel (163 children)
- Mosney (352 children)
- The Lodge (34 children)
- Flaxmill House (20 children)
- The Old Forge (18 children)
- Collegelands Forge (14 children)

The Impact

- 601 children received support
- 7 Direct Provision centres engaged
- €12,020 in total distributed
- Emotional and practical relief for families during the festive season
- Increased sense of inclusion and recognition for asylum-seeking families

A well-organised and transparent distribution plan ensured families received their vouchers in time for Christmas, enabling them to buy gifts and essentials that reflected their cultural and personal needs. This initiative was made possible thanks to the Lakeside Fund and the dedication of centre staff, Cultúr volunteers, and coordinators together creating moments of joy, dignity, and belonging for families often left on the margins.




